Bradninch's Part in the D-Day Operation – the Names and Codes

With 2024 marking the 80th anniversary of Operation Neptune – D-Day – we will recount a few episodes that Bradninch played a not insignificant part in its overall achievements.

The winter appeared to be a time of endless training, practicing and of course - dancing.

By way of some explanation what did all the acronyms and codes so beloved by the military mean?

Cracking the codes.

Code names and acronyms were vital to swathe the planning and build up by the allies in secrecy. Here are some -

- D-Day (see below) & H-Hour The date and hour of the operation
- **Bolero** the build to D-Day in Britain.
- **Operation Overlord** the overall invasion plan.
- **Operation Neptune** the seabourne operation.
- **Mulberry** the artificial harbours towed across the channel and so vital to the invasion.
- Ham & Jam the signal indicating the bridges at Benouville (Pegasus bridge) and Ranville were secured by Allied forces. (See Hedley Vicary in part 3).
- And the beaches Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno and Sword.

What does the "D" in D-Day stand for?

The words "deliverance", "disembarkation" and "doom" have all been suggested as meanings for the "D".

The letter is actually derived from the word "Day" on which any military operation begins. The day before is "D-1" and day after "D+1". This has the advantage that if the date of an operation changed military planners would not have to change all the dates in their plans. I suppose it is akin to the modern concept of a "date variable" in computer speak.

TOWN MAYORS REPORT, JANUARY 2024

Dear Residents

Town Council Meetings

The Town Council meets on the second Monday of the month, and the meeting is open to the public. A portion of the meeting is set aside so that residents can come and speak to the council on any matters they want to raise with us.

At the January meeting, councillors resolved to purchase Floodsax as a flood defence for the residence on Hen Street, thanks to the grant funding secured by Sue Eakers. These have now been distributed to the affected residents.

The council has asked DCC Highways to consider moving the designated bus stop road markings on Hele Road, opposite Westfield, further along Hele Road nearer to the allotment site entrance. This is for safety reasons after a resident raised a concern.

Councillors also agreed to consult with the town on the issue of how we control the weeds in the town. It has been over a year since we resolved not to use glyphosate-based weedkillers, and this has allowed us to try alternative methods. This has provoked a lot of feedback, both positive and negative, so the council felt it was important to have an open discussion on a way forward. Residents are invited to attend this month's full council meeting at 7 p.m. on Monday, February 12th, and have their say.

We get a lot of correspondence from residents concerned about damage to our pavement and roads. It is now possible to report these issues to Devon Highways directly using the report a problem' online DCC Highways link at https://www.devon.gov.uk/ roads-and-transport/report-a-problem/

Dignity in death

On entering hospital it is now standard practice for the admitting clinical team to discuss with you what treatment you want if you become critically ill. This information is recorded on a document called a Treatment Escalation Plan (TEP) form. This focuses on which treatments may or may not be most helpful for you. A variety of treatments can be considered, such as antibiotics, artificial feeding or ventilation of your lungs. The option of whether it would be helpful or not to readmit you to hospital in the future for further treatments may also be included in your plan.

The most important part of this discussion is what happens if your heart stops beating. This will happen to all of us at some point in our lives and for the vast majority it will be the moment of our death. The TEP form looks at the important issue of cardiopulmonary resuscitation, also known as CPR. This is the medical treatment that can be used to try to restart the heart and lungs if they suddenly stop working. It includes chest compressions and the use of a defibrillator to shock the heart back into beating. While resuscitation can be successful for some people, for others it is very unlikely to work. CPR can be very traumatic and it is not a suitable treatment for everybody. The older you are the less likely that you will recover your previous level of mental and physical function. The TEP form can be used to document the resuscitation decision that is right for your individual circumstances. If you decide that CPR would not be the right thing to do for you then the doctor will fill this in on the TEP form. It is called a do not attempt (try) to resuscitate or DNA CPR.

Until now this recording of a patient's wishes was held on a piece of paper that could easily get misplaced. In the next few months these TEP forms will be available for all medical professionals to access on the Devon and Cornwall Care record. This is a new secure computer system that brings together information about your health and care and presents it as a single record. Healthcare staff can now see the details held by GP practices, hospitals and other health and care organisations across Devon, Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly.

Having a more complete view of your medical history helps healthcare professionals identify problems more effectively and make quicker diagnoses. For instance, they can see which allergies you suffer from, any treatment and medication you have received plus quickly understand advance care decisions you have made using a TEP form. You do not have to be in hospital to complete a TEP form. GPs are very happy to have this conversation with patients and complete the form together. It is actually more sensible to have the discussion when you are well rather than when you are sick and having to deal with the disorientating circumstances of being admitted to hospital.

We all understand the importance of writing a Will. Over the next few years, I think completing a TEP will be considered in a similar way. The fact that we can now record the information so it is easily accessed by hospital and ambulance teams means it can be reviewed and changed at any point with everyone knowing exactly what your wishes are.

The successful applicant will be employed for four hours per week during term time. They will provide all necessary identity documents for DBS checks. They will open the Youth Club every Tuesday & Wednesday nights from 7pm – 9 pm during term times as per agreed rota. The youth club is open to secondary school pupils.

Duties include assisting the Youth Leader:

New Benches for the Guildhall

Some of the eagle-eyed among you may have noticed two brand new benches outside the Guildhall. These will provide a place for people to rest and chat to others, whether they know them or not. It also provides a place for people to enjoy the outside of the Guildhall whilst waiting for an event or as a place to rest and recover for people living with mobility issues

The previous hard wood benches had succumbed to the ravages of time and weather and had to be removed last year. We have since been fund raising for replacements. We would like to extend our gratitude to the donors of the previous benches, Sylvia Goff in memory of her husband Rodney and Barbara Crispin in memory of her husband Tony. The seats gave years of service to our community.

In the interest of ecology and long life the decision was made that the new benches would be made of recycled plastic with cast metal ends which should provide 25+ years continual use with little requirement for painting or repairs. Unlike traditional timber, recycled plastic will not absorb water meaning it won't split or rot and has no need for annual treatment or painting.



The benches are in large part due to the kind donations of our community as well as the support of several local clubs and societies. We would like to thank all the people who supported the fund raising at

two of our recent coffee mornings. Special thanks also needs to go to Mike Leonard who raised



funds from kindling, jams & chutneys, scavenging etc , and who help coordinate much of the fund raising and in no small part donated himself. Judith Wright and the 1st Monday club raised money as did the Musical Gardens, Bradninch Memorial fund and Devon County Councillor John Berry.

We hope the new benches are used as much as the old by creating a welcoming, inclusive, accessible and well-located social space to meet, chat, rest and enjoy the benefits of being outside, we believe the benches will make a real difference to the lives of local people.






